## **YOUTH ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES**

The Annie E. Casey Foundation strives to support and partner with young people to inform and influence its youth-focused work and strategies — and to achieve results effectively. Engaging affected communities and stakeholders is one of the Foundation's key steps for advancing racial and ethnic equity and inclusion.

This tool aims to help teams assess when youth engagement makes sense, the various forms it can take — including potential activities for staff and young people — and the feasibility, benefits and challenges of each. Teams may also utilize different youth engagement strategies at different phases of work. For example, youth may collaborate with staff at the start of a project and be consulted later in the work.
