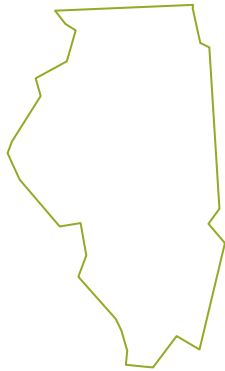

There are written policies to identify and serve expectant and parenting youth in foster care under 21 years old.

Data are collected on young women and men who are expectant and parenting; the number of children of young women in foster care; the number of healthy births and custodial status of children of parents in foster care; and the race and ethnicity, length of stay and permanency status of parenting youth in foster care.

The state of Illinois provides extended foster care to age 21 under Title IV-E and Chafee services to 23.
