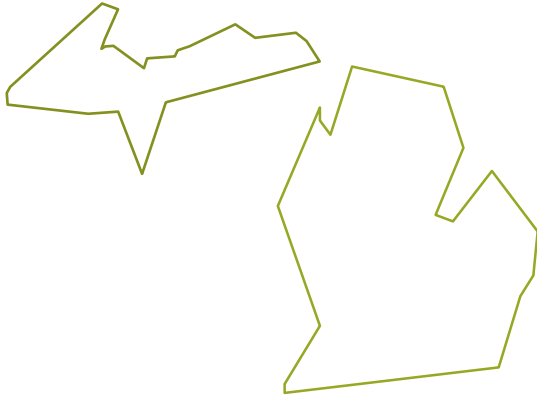


# Michigan



There are no written policies to identify and serve expectant and parenting youth in foster care.

Data are collected on the number and custodial status of children of parents in foster care, the number of healthy births of children of parents in foster care and the permanency status of parenting youth in foster care. Note: Data on programs are only collected when a youth is placed with department and the department makes the referrals.

The state of Michigan provides extended foster care to age 21 under Title IV-E and Chafee services up to age 23.
