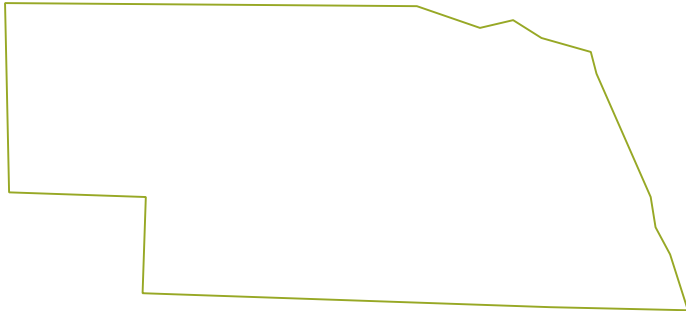

Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services State-Administered Structure

There are written policies and practices to identify and serve expectant and parenting youth in foster care.

Data are collected on state wards under the age of 19 who are pregnant, the number of healthy births (and non-live births) to parents in foster care, the permanency status of parenting youth in foster care and the expected delivery/delivery dates of children of parents in foster care.

The state of Nebraska provides extended foster care to age 21 under Title IV-E and Chafee services up to age 23.
