Put in the work from the start. Build rapport, answer questions, and address concerns immediately. It's more than just issuing policies and procedures.

Establish collaborative of multiple groups invested in reducing youth contact with police.

 Judge, prosecution and defense attorneys, probation, civil rights groups, people who are system-impacted



Tailor information sharing to the needs of different ranks and roles.

- Provide appropriate type of information and training depending on who you are speaking with.
- Determine methods of institutionalizing practices to sustain through personnel movement.

Meet them where they are at. You may need to compromise on language, but not on your values. Step into your power and strengths.





Emphasize shared restorative justice diversion goals.

- We collectively care about public safety, accountability, and resolution.
- Using data helps set aside debates based on assumptions or conjecture.

Be persistent. Acknowledge the challenge of balancing several priorities in each role. Remain committed and consistent to make progress.





Strive for accountability and transparency across all collaborative entities. Maintain clear and open lines of communication. Model what it looks like to repair harm.
